REPORT ON THE CURRENT STATUS OF CORRUPTION MATTERS UNDER INVESTIGATION TO THE PRESIDENCY

20TH MARCH 2015

ΡΔRΤΙ

BACKGROUND

In the recent years, corruption and unethical behaviour in conduct of public and private affairs has gained root in Kenya. Conduct of government or public procurement processes have been questionable in many instances. Public resources have been pilfered through dubious government tender processes as mostly mishandled by the some\public officers facilitated by unscrupulous private businessmen and entities. This has earned the country bad reputation, increased poverty levels and decline in socio-economic and infrastructural development. This state of affairs has led to despair among the public, negative effect on the economy, skewed service delivery and eventually posed challenge to the larger governance of the country.

The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) is statutory body established under the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission Act of 2011. The Act was enacted pursuant to the requirements in Article 79 of the Constitution. The mandate of the Commission is *to combat corruption and economic crime in Kenya through law enforcement, prevention, public education and promotion of ethical standards and practices*. Apart from Act aforesaid and the constitutional mandate conferred on it specifically in enforcement and ensuring compliance with Chapter Six of the Constitution, the Commission also derives its statutory mandate from a number of other statutes namely, the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes Act of 2003, the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 and the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003. It reports to the National Assembly and the President, through submission of quarterly and Annual Reports on its activities and also occasional briefs and reports on the need basis.

COMMISSION WORKING STRUCTURE:

The EACC, in its endeavour to serve and reach a wide cross section of Kenyans has recruited qualified staff and developed a Strategic Plan which will drive its activities for the period 2013 to 2018. The Commission comprises of six directorates based on its mandate as provided for in the Anti-Corruption and Economic Crimes (ACECA) Act - 2003, Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC) Act - 2011 and the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012. These are:

Investigation Ethics and Leadership Legal Services Preventive Services Finance and Planning Human Resources and Administration

In compliance with Sec 3 (3) of the EACC Act, the Commission opened nine (9) regional offices in, Mombasa (which covers South Coast), North Coast (Malindi), Lower Eastern (Machakos), Upper Eastern (Isiolo), North Eastern (Garissa), North Rift (Eldoret), South Rift (Nakuru), Central (Nyeri) and Western (Kisumu); and two (2) satellite offices in strategic ports of entry, namely Jomo Kenyatta International Airport (JKIA) and Malaba.

EACC CORRUPTION PREVENTION MECHANISMS AND ACTIVITIES:

The Commission mainstreams corruption prevention at the National Government through the performance contracting framework which contains Corruption Eradication Indicator. All public institutions under

performance contracting are required to implement corruption prevention activities under the indicator. The Commission has partnered with the Performance Contracting Department for a period of 8 years.

In the Financial Year 2014/2015, a total of 350 public institutions signed the Performance Contract and committed to level 4 of the Corruption Eradication Indicator (which seeks to ensure zero indices of corruption in public institutions). All institutions submit quarterly progress reports to the EACC. So far, 47 such institutions benefited from PC related advisory.

Currently, the Commission is carrying out an evaluation and impact assessment of the implementation of the Corruption Eradication Indicator under the PC to determine the outcomes and impact of the corruption prevention initiatives being undertaken by public bodies the performance contracting framework. Over 350 public institutions are to be covered in the impact assessment which began on 26th January 2015 and expected to be completed by 31st March, 2014.

The Commission undertakes examination of systems, policies, procedures and practices of public bodies to identify corruption loopholes and recommend measures to seal such loopholes. In the current financial year, the Commission has undertaken 2 Corruption Risk Assessments at Kenya National Bureau of Statistics (KNBS) and National Youth Service (NYS). The KNBS report was completed and formerly launched on 2nd December, 2014. The report on NYS is currently being reviewed and will be completed by 28th February, 2015. Currently, the Commission is undertaking an examination into the systems, policies, procedures and practices of Parliamentary Service Commission focusing on financial management.

Under the Leadership and Integrity Act No. 19 of 2012, the Commission is mandated to promote and enforce ethical practices and standards. To achieve this, Directorate of Ethics and Leadership was created in 2013 and has therefore been operational for the purpose of monitoring and enforcing leadership and integrity issues.

In the period 2012/2013, 2013/2014 and 2014/3015 (up to December 2014), the Commission made tremendous strides in corruption prevention. The focus has been on the national and county government institutions and staff, systems, policies and procedures of operations and services delivery that are prone to corrupt practices.

The Commission has undertaken the Prevention Advisory in 16 counties from January 28th, 2014 to December 31st 2014. The key output of the advisory programme is an action plan signed by the County Government as a commitment to address corruption in their respective departments, functions and operations.

It is noteworthy to state that in the history of the Commission this is the highest number of cases the institution has handled involving high profile personalities. It is also important to state that during this period the Commission handled the highest number of investigation files ever.

PART II

RESOURCE REQUIREMENT

In order to carry out more and increase productivity, the Commission needs to be facilitated as outlined hereunder;

A. ALLOCATION OF ADEQUATE RESOURCES TO THE EACC

2014/15 BUDGET ALLOCATION

2014/15 Main Appropriation: The Commission received a total of Kenya Shillings 1,823,600,000 (One billion, Eight Hundred, Twenty Three Million and Six Hundred Thousand) budget allocation from the Government in the Printed Estimates to finance its operations over 2014/2015 financial year under the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Programme. The allocation comprises Kshs. 1,546,000,000 and Kshs. 277,600,000, which will finance Recurrent and Development expenditure respectively. This allocation is lower than what the Commission had requested from the National Treasury. During the 2014/15-2016/17 MTEF Budget circle, the Commission requested for Kshs 3.7 Billion Budget allocation comprising of Kshs 3.1 Billion to finance recurrent expenditure and Kshs 600 to finance Development Expenditure. Further, it should be noted that budget allocation to the Commission should average Kshs. 3.5 Billion with adequate development budget allocation to meet capital expenditure requirements. Past and current financial year budget allocation to EACC is provided in table 1 below.

The implementation of 2014/15 financial year budget portends serious challenge to the Commission given the huge reduction in allocation when compared to request and requirements that continuous to increase year after year. Some of the challenges are:

1) Low staff complement and poor staff welfare: The Commission has an authorized staff establishment 2246 officers, as per the approved Job Evaluation. By December 2014, the Commission had only 290 Officers inpost. This number increased marginally in January 2015 after finalizing the recruitment of 95 officers (a total of 385 as at February 2015). The details of Commission's past and current level of staff establishment are provided in table 2 below. Given the low staff complement the Commission is not able to effectively discharge its mandate. Besides, most of the staff at the Commission has stagnated for long period at their current grades. The Commission will be seeking additional funds to allow promotion of staff that has stagnated at various grades for long. Besides, the Commission is operating with a salary structure, which has been in used since 2005 (over 10 years). This should also be addressed.

The Commission in her endeavor to enhance staff welfare, converted the terms of service for all staff serving as Deputy Directors to Office Assistants (grade 4 to 12) to permanent and pensionable. Consequently, the Commission has established a staff pension scheme. However, the Commission still has to address certain staff welfare requirements to remain a competitive employer and be able to attract and retain qualified staff. One of the key staff welfare enhancement measures that the Commission intends to put in place is the provision of staff mortgage and car loan facility as a proved by the Salaries and Remuneration Commission.

- 2) Delays in the implementation of regional expansion programme: The Commission has managed to open and operationalize its offices in only five regions (Mombasa, Eldoret, Nyeri, Garisa and Kisumu) and has just recently opened offices and posted officers to Isiolo, Nakuru, Malindi, Machakos, JKIA and Malaba. The six new offices are still not properly equipped and therefore cannot operate optimally. Besides, the Commission had intended to open and operationalize additional 12 Regional Offices and County Huduma Reporting Centers in 35 Counties where it does not have a regional office. With low budget allocation this expansion programme had to be delayed.
- 3) In adequate Investigative Equipment: Currently, the Commission does not have adequate specialized equipment to carry out surveillance and forensic analysis. Besides, most of the equipment it is using today is

obsolete given the speed of change in technological advancement. Adequate budget allocation should therefore be provided to cater for this need.

- 4) Reduced programmes, operations and maintenance: In order to discharge its mandate, the Commission had identified and prioritized key programmes and activities, with clear targets, to be implemented over the current financial year. These programmes and activities were estimated to cost Kshs. 840 Million. Given the low funding, the Commission has been forced to lower the number and scope of programmes and activities to be implemented hence lowering its annual performance targets. After factoring the financial resource requirements for personnel emolument, the Commission is only left with Kshs 800 Million to finance Operations and Maintenance. It is also important to note that most of the allocation to Operations and Maintenance will be allocated to non-discretionary areas/activities are: (a) Provision of Insurance Cover with an estimated cost of Kshs. 99,000,000 to cater for medical, group life, group accident, travel, motor vehicles, building and equipment (will require more funding to accommodate newly recruited staff); (b) Rentals and related expenses (Electricity and Water) with an estimated cost of Kshs. 60,000,000. Adequate budgetary allocation should be provided to cater for programmes, operations and maintenance.
- 5) Delays in the purchase of headquarter office premise: The Commission is currently operating on a rental property and is spending on average Khs. 70 Million on the rental charges and other related payments. In the immediate past, the Commission has received a note from the landlord indicating that the tenancy agreement will not be renewed once it lapses by the end of 2014/15 financial year. The need to provide adequate office space for Commission headquarters remains a pressing challenge that should be addressed urgently. Adequate financial allocation will also be required to allow the Commission to purchase an ideal office premise.

2015/16 BUDGET ALLOCATION

The Commission has been allocated tentative budgetary ceiling of Kenya Shillings 2,162,000,000 (Two billion, One Hundred and Sixty Two Million) in the (yet to be finalized) 2015/16-2017/18 MTEF Budget circle to finance its operations over 2015/2016 financial year under the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Programme. The ceiling comprises Kshs. 1,562,000,000 and Kshs. 600,000,000, which will finance Recurrent and Development expenditure respectively. These ceilings are lower than what the Commission had requested from the National Treasury. Considering the budget constraints and measures put in place by the National Treasury, the Commission had requested for a minimum Kshs 2.623 Billion Budgetary allocation comprising of Kshs 2.023 Billion to finance recurrent expenditure and Kshs 600 to finance Development Expenditure. It should therefore be noted that the request made was a constrained one and therefore did not cater for all the urgent requirements of the Commission given that all MDAs had to adhere to guidelines provided by the National Treasury. Commissions' Budgetary requirements and tentative ceilings for 2015/16 – 2017/18 MTEF period are summarized in the table below.

With this ceiling, the Commission will be **faced with serious budget deficits** and as such most of its operational requirements will not be funded. Further, the Commission will not be able to address the above challenges. Table 4 below provides a summary of the key requirements of the Commission **that are not funded under the current ceiling**, which should be catered for under the ceiling for 2015/16 MTEF Budget.

As detailed in the above table, the Commission will require additional budgetary allocation of Kshs 2.431 billion above its current ceiling as provided in the BPS so as to allow the Commission to effectively discharge its mandate and in particular to address the following key targets and requirements:

- The need to track the expanded national budget, estimated at Kshs 1.7 Trillion, at National and County Government as well as other funds including donor funded programmes;
- The need to respond to the growing public demand for Commission services;
- The need to enhance the quality of work and enhance overall work output in all areas of operations. The Commission will be targeting to trace and recover corruptly acquired assets valued at over Kshs. 50 Billion and to disrupt corruption network and avert loss averaging Kshs. 50 Billion;
- Need to undertake systems reviews in about 100 public institution to enhance efficiency in their service delivery;
- The need to execute advisory programmes on anticorruption, ethics and leadership in all the 47 county governments and national public institutions;
- The need to put in place a comprehensive and automated mechanism that is currently manual to review the wealth declaration by state and public officers,
- The need to modernize its investigative equipment to cope with the changing trends of corruption and economic crime; and
- The need to secure adequate headquarter office premise and to release the huge budgetary allocations tied on rental payments to other operational areas.

Based on the above, Commission total budgetary requirement for 2015/16 MTEF Budget period is estimated at Kshs 5.054 Billion and is summarized in table 5 below.

The Commission is therefore seeking the support of this Committee in lobbying for an enhanced 205/16 MTEF Budget ceilings so as to accommodate its additional budgetary requirements.

STRENGTHENING THE LEGAL FRAMEWORK

In order to effectively discharge it's mandated the Commission requires a strong legal framework. Though efforts have been made to strengthen the existing Anti-Corruption Laws there is still some inadequacy in the law that needs to be remedied. Towards this end the Commission in 2014 made proposals for amendments of the main anti-corruption laws. Only a few of the proposed amendments were passed through the Statute Law (Miscellaneous Amendments) Act, 2014.

There are some of the proposed amendments that were not considered under the miscellaneous amendment Act. These need to be done.

B. REMUNERATION STRUCTURE:

The Salaries and Remuneration Commission, in the exercise of its mandate, has established a remuneration structure in respect of all state offices. It has set thresholds of remuneration applicable for the various constitutional commissions, which are placed in different categories. EACC holds the view that its placement in the SRC banding was unfair, taking into account the expansive and critical importance of its mandate in the country. EACC has continually engaged the Salaries and Remuneration Commission to enhance the remuneration level of the Commission, but to no avail.

In addition, the **SRC** purported to advice on the remuneration levels for the rest of the EACC staff, which amounts prescribed were too low such that if they were to be implemented, the Commission would not have managed to retain, let alone attract, staff for the secretariat. The Commission engaged the SRC in negotiations over the matter, culminating in an understanding that EACC retains the existing remuneration. It is noteworthy that the existing rates of remuneration have never been reviewed for the last ten years or so, with the result that the Commission now remains among the most poorly rated institutions in terms of staff remuneration.

Attached hereto are copies of letters exchanged between the EACC and SRC, evidencing the negotiations on remuneration of staff.

THE CASE FOR IMPROVED REMUNERATION FOR ETHICS AND ANTI-CORRUPTION COMMISSION

a) Staff Establishment

As at 27th February, 2015, the staff complement stands at 385 against an approved establishment of 2246. The Commission plans to grow its complement gradually based on the available funding in order to increase its

regional presence. This will be done through opening new regional offices in addition to the current 9 and deploying officers to Huduma Centres in areas where it has no established offices.

b) Staff Turnover and Career Stagnation

Since inception, over 200 members of staff have left the Commission citing lack of career progression and static remuneration among other reasons. In the last one year alone 20 members of staff have left the Commission, majority of them in pursuit for better prospects and career growth in the private sector and other government agencies. To address this concern, the Commission undertook a Job Evaluation Exercise through the Ministry of Devolution and Planning, Directorate of Public Service Management and on adoption of the Report, converted its terms to Permanent and Pensionable for positions below EACC Grade 3. (Directors).

c) Salary Structure

The Job Evaluation Report adopted by the Commission proposed a new salary structure which was forwarded to Salaries and Remuneration Commission for approval. The proposed salary scales allowed for broader bands for growth within the scale. However, SRC declined to approve the proposed structure and asked the Commission to hold on the prevailing salary structure. The prevailing remuneration package was issued in 2005 and provides for only three points for growth within the grades. This has led to staff stagnating in the same pay point for 10 years and has contributed to a great extent the high staff turnover. Table 6 below shows the current salary structure, while Table 7 depicts the proposed salary structures (contract and Permanent and Pensionable). It is our considered view that if the proposed salary structure is adopted as envisaged under the Job Evaluation Exercise, salary stagnation and high staff turnover will be addressed to a great degree and staff will be motivated to deliver on the Commission's mandate.

PART III

INVESTIGATION REPORTS

Over the years the commission received numerous reports, which can be categorized into two, those relevant to the commissions mandate and those not relevant which are referred to the relevant government agencies for action.

Reports relevant to the commission are usually many against the limited resources in the commission; hence this has necessitated the commission to develop a criterion that is used when prioritizing and allocating reports for investigations. Prioritisation of matters to be investigated is based on public interest and financial value of the subject matter.

These reports are analysed and once satisfying the standards, forwarded to the DPP for prosecution or any further action pursuant to Section 35 of the Anti- Corruption and Economic Crimes Act, 2003.

Based on these facts, the Commission has received and therefore dealing with the following cases. The reports are handled at various levels and are they are at different stages of receipt, analyses and actions.

1. MINISTRY OF LANDS:

IRREGULAR LAND DEALS

The Ministry of Lands is bedeviled with rampant corruption involving irregular acquisition and fraudulent disposal of public land through a network of cartel linked to Cabinet Secretary Charity Ngilu, senior ministry officials, politicians and brokers. They include Patrick Kibagendi Osero, of Agricultural Finance Corporation (AFC) Board, lawyer James Mbaluka, Sarah Mwenda, Chief Lands Officer, Businessman Deepak Kamani, and Senator Mike Mbuvi Sonko. The land in question includes those in: Karen, Ruai, Beach Plots, Kenya Meat Commission land in the Coast, 930 acres of land belonging to Evanson Waitiki in Likoni.

Specific cases at the ministry where investigations have been concluded include;

2. MINISTRY OF ENERGY: IRREGULARITIES ON VARIOUS PROJECTS

The Ministry of Energy and Petroleum is riddled with massive corruption. The CS Davis Chirchir is alleged to be perpetrating corruption in the Ministry's tenders and procurement process. He is accused of working to ensure that corrupt deals in the energy sector are successfully executed. A case in point is where there was an attempt to influence award of a Kenya Pipeline Company [KPC] tender costing US\$500 million to SINOPEC instead of ZAKHEM. The tender was meant to corruptly yield US\$ 15 million which was to be shared between Davis Chirchir and Senator Mike Mbuvi.

3. MINISTRY OF LABOUR, SOCIAL SECURITY AND SERVICES

I. Cabinet Secretary Kazungu Kambi is allegedly involved in corruption deals at NSSF which falls under his Ministry. Kambi has Come out strongly in support of the NSSF Tassia 11 project despite clear indications that the Board of Trustees did not approve the project's revised cost estimate of Kshs.5,053billion from KShs.3.304 billion as required by procurement laws and that the alleged approval by way of email circulation was improper and irregular.

II. TASSIA Phase II Upgrade Project [100 acres]

The controversy of the TASSIA Phase II Upgrade involves Cabinet Secretary Kazungu Kambi, NSSF senior management and Property Development Manager.

4. MINISTRY OF INFRASTRUCTURE:

The Cabinet Secretary for Infrastructure Eng. Michael Kamau has various roads tender award manipulation cases. These include conflict of interest that involves a consultancy company that is associated with him, APEC consulting. This company is alleged to have inflated the SGR consultancy fees involving billions of Kenya shillings.

In this same ministry, the PS for Transport Mr Nduva Muli has various Kenya Railways lands issues that have continued even after he left the corporation for his current office at the ministry.
