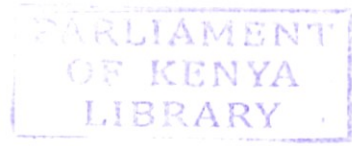

FOREWORD

This report contains proceedings of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs during the approval hearing of a person nominated for appointment as the Secretary to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC), as forwarded by the EACC and communicated to the House by the Speaker of the National Assembly on Monday, 25th November 2024.

In accordance with Article 250(12) of the Constitution and section 16(6) of the EACC Act, Cap. 7H, the Commission caused the vacancy in the office of the Secretary to the Commission to be advertised on Tuesday, 17th September 2024, at least three months before the expiry of the incumbent's term.

The Rt. Honourable Speaker vide Message No. 001 of 2024 conveyed to the House the Message from the EACC and subsequently referred it and the curriculum vitae of the nominee to the Committee for approval hearing in accordance with section 4 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F and section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H. While referring the matter to the Committee, the Speaker directed that the Committee undertakes the vetting exercise and table its report within twenty-eight (28) days on or before Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 in accordance with section 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F. The Rt. Hon Speaker further directed the Clerk of the National Assembly to notify the nominee and the general public of the time and place of holding the approval hearing.

In fulfilment of the provisions of Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(3) and (4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F and Standing Order 45(3) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the nominee and placed an advertisement dated 25th November 2024 in the print media informing the nominee and the general public that the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs would conduct the approval hearing on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 in the Mini Chamber, 1st Floor, County Hall, Parliament Buildings.

Additionally, and pursuant to section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement dated 25th November 2024 in the print media inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Monday, 2nd December 2024 at 5.00 pm. By close of the submission deadline, the Committee had received two memoranda which it considered and found that they do not contest the suitability of the nominee for appointment but challenge the constitutionality of section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.

The Clerk of the National Assembly also wrote to the DCI, HELB, EACC, ODPP, KRA, ORPP and CUE seeking references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee.

The nominee appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 as scheduled and the Committee examined his suitability based on the criteria set out in section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F including the procedure used to arrive at the nominee, the constitutional and statutory requirements relating to the office in question and suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed, having regard to

whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the office in question. Furthermore, the Committee examined the nominee's academic credentials, relevant professional training and experience, knowledge of sector issues and personal integrity in accordance with section 6(7) and (8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F.

The Committee, having held the approval hearing for the nominee regarding his suitability, observed that the nominee met the integrity threshold; demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues relating to the EACC; and had the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience to be approved for appointment.

The Committee therefore recommends that this House approves Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud as the Secretary of the EACC.

The Committee wishes to thank the Offices of the Speaker and of the Clerk of the National Assembly for the technical support accorded to it during the exercise. The Committee further extends its appreciation to the nominee for his cooperation during the parliamentary approval process. The Committee also appreciates the EACC, ODPP, ORPP and CUE for providing references and background checks relating to the suitability of the nominee. Finally, I acknowledge and appreciate the Honourable Members of the Committee, and the Committee Secretariat, who sat for long hours and made useful contributions towards the preparation and production of this report.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs and pursuant to section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H, section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F and the provisions of Standing Order 199(6) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, it is now my duty and privilege to present to the House the Report of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs on the Approval Hearing of Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud, Nominee for Appointment as the Secretary to the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission.

CHAPTER ONE

1 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

1. The Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs is one of twenty departmental committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 of the National Assembly Standing Orders whose mandate pursuant to the **Standing Order 216 (5)** is as follows—
 - i. *To investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;*
 - ii. *To study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;*
 - iii. *To, on a quarterly basis, monitor and report on the implementation of the national budget in respect of its mandate;*
 - iv. *To study and review all legislation referred to it;*
 - v. *To study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;*
 - vi. *To investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary, and as may be referred to them by the House;*
 - vii. *To vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (Committee on Appointments);*
 - viii. *To examine treaties, agreements and conventions;*
 - ix. *To make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendations of proposed legislation;*
 - x. *To consider reports of Commissions and Independent Offices submitted to the House pursuant to the provisions of Article 254 of the Constitution; and*
 - xi. *To examine any questions raised by Members on a matter within its mandate.*

1.2 Mandate of the Committee

2. In accordance with the Second Schedule of the National Assembly Standing Orders, the Committee is mandated to consider matters regarding—
 - a) The Judiciary;
 - b) Tribunals;
 - c) Access to Justice;
 - d) Public prosecutions;
 - e) Ethics, Integrity and Anti-corruption;
 - f) Correctional services;
 - g) Community service orders and witness protection;
 - h) Constitutional Affairs;
 - i) Sovereign immunity;
 - j) Elections including referenda;
 - k) Human rights;
 - l) Political parties; and

m) The State Law Office, including insolvency, law reform, public trusteeship, marriages and legal education.

3. In executing its mandate, the Committee oversees the following Ministries/Departments—

- a) State Department of Correctional Services;
- b) State Law Office and Department of Justice;
- c) The Judiciary;
- d) Judicial Service Commission;
- e) Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions;
- f) Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission;
- g) Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission;
- h) Commission on Administrative Justice;
- i) Office of the Registrar of Political Parties;
- j) Witness Protection Agency;
- k) Kenya National Commission on Human Rights;
- l) Kenya Law Reform Commission; and
- m) Council of Legal Education.

CHAPTER TWO

2 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal Framework

6. The Committee was guided by the following provisions of the Constitution and statutes in executing its mandate:
 - 1) Article 10 of the Constitution on the national values and principles of governance;
 - 2) Chapter 6 of the Constitution on leadership and integrity;
 - 3) Article 77 of the Constitution on restriction on activities of State Officers;
 - 4) Article 78 of the Constitution on dual citizenship;
 - 5) Article 118 of the Constitution on public participation;
 - 6) Article 124(4) of the Constitution on consideration of persons for appointment to public office;
 - 7) Article 232 of the Constitution on values and principles of public service;
 - 8) Article 250(12) on the appointment of a secretary of a constitutional commission;
 - 9) The Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap. 7F;
 - 10) The Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission, Cap. 7H;
 - 11) The Public Officer Ethics Act, Cap. 185B; and
 - 12) The Leadership and Integrity Act, Cap. 185C.

2.2 Selection Process

7. Vide an advertisement placed in the print media on Tuesday, 17th September 2024 and in accordance with Article 250(12) of the Constitution and section 16(6) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H, the Commission invited applications from qualified persons for the position of Secretary to the EACC, at least three months before the expiry of the incumbent's term. The advertisement appeared in the Daily Nation, the Standard, My GOV. and the EACC Website and was closed on 7th October 2024.
8. To this end, the Commission received one hundred and seventy-two (172) applications out of which fourteen (14) candidates were shortlisted and interviewed from 19th to 21st November 2024. Consequently, and following a competitive recruitment process, the Commission nominated Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud for appointment as the Secretary/CEO to the EACC.

2.3 Notification of Nomination

9. Sections 3 and 5 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F stipulate as follows—

“3. Exercise of powers of appointment

An appointment under the Constitution or any other law for which the approval of Parliament is required shall not be made unless the appointment is approved or deemed to have been approved by Parliament in accordance with this Act.

5. Notification of nomination

- (1) An appointing authority shall, upon nominating a person for an appointment to which this Act applies, notify the relevant House of Parliament accordingly.*
- (2) A notification under subsection (1) shall be —*

(a) in writing;

(b) be lodged with the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament.

(3) A notification of appointment shall be accompanied by information concerning the nominee, having regard to the issues mentioned in section 7.

(4) For purposes of this Act, a notification of nomination shall be deemed to be duly given on the day on which it complies fully with subsections (2) and (3).”

10. Pursuant to section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H as read with the aforementioned provisions of law, the Chairperson of the EACC transmitted to the Speaker of the National Assembly the Report of the Commission (*Annexure 3*) and the nominee’s curriculum vitae (*Annexure 9*) vide a letter referenced *EACC.2/8/1 (280)* dated 22nd November 2024.

2.4 Notification to the House and Referral to the Committee

11. Pursuant to the provisions of section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H as read together with section 5(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary) Approval Act, Cap 7F, the Speaker, on Monday, 25th November 2024, conveyed to the House a Message from the EACC (*Annexure 4*) on nomination of a person for appointment as the Secretary to the EACC.

12. Pursuant to section 8(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F, the name and curriculum vitae of the nominee was referred to the Committee for approval hearing and reporting to the House within twenty-eight (28) days on or before Tuesday, 3rd December 2024.

2.5 Notification to the Public

13. Article 118 of the Constitution provides that Parliament shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative business and other business of Parliament and its Committees.

14. Section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F further provides that the Clerk shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing.

15. Consequently, and in accordance with Article 118 of the Constitution, section 6(4) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F and Standing Order 45(3) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement (*Annexure 5*) dated 25th November 2024 in the print media informing the nominee and the general public that the Committee would conduct the approval hearing on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 at 9.00 am in the Mini Chamber, 1st Floor, County Hall, Parliament Buildings.

16. Moreover, section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F provides that “any person may, prior to the approval hearings and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated”.

17. Pursuant to Article 118 of the Constitution as read with section 6(9) of Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F, the Clerk of the National Assembly placed an advertisement dated 25th November 2024 in the print media inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of a written statement on oath (affidavit) on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee in conformity with section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F. The advertisement indicated that the submissions were to be received by Monday, 2nd December 2024 at 5.00 pm, respectively.
18. At the close of the submission deadline, the Committee had received two memoranda which it considered and found that they do not contest the suitability of the nominee for appointment but challenge the constitutionality of section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.

2.6 Notification to the Nominee

19. The Clerk of the National Assembly vide a letter dated 26th November 2024 referenced *NA/DDC/JLAC/VETT/2024(016) (Annexure 6)* invited the nominee for the approval hearing in accordance with section 6(3) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F.

2.7 Clearance and Compliance Requirements

20. Vide letters dated 26th November 2024 and referenced *NA/DDC/JLAC/VETT/2024 (009), (010), (011), (012), (013), (014) and (015)*, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the EACC, DCI, HELB, KRA, ORPP, ODPP and CUE (*Annexure 7*) requesting for reports with respect to the nominee on the following matters:
- a) ethics and integrity;
 - b) criminal records;
 - c) higher education loan repayment(s);
 - d) tax compliance;
 - e) political party affiliations;
 - f) active criminal court proceedings; and
 - g) authenticity of academic certificates.
21. The following institutions wrote back to the National Assembly clearing the nominee: EACC vide letter *Ref No. EACC.7/10/5 VOL XXX (8)* dated 28th November 2024; ORPP vide letter *Ref No. RPP/ORG/34 VOL.VIII (44)* dated 28th November 2024; ODPP vide letter *Ref No. ODPP/CONF/5A* dated 28th November 2024; and CUE vide letter *Ref No. CUE/10/9 VOL. 34* dated 29th November 2024 (*Annexure 8*).
22. At the time of the approval hearing, the DCI, HELB and KRA had not responded. However, the nominee had provided the relevant clearances from the agencies.

2.8 Criteria for Consideration during the Approval Hearings

23. Section 6(7) and (8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F provides that:
- “(7) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate’s academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.*

(8) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate”.

24. Additionally, section 7 of the Act provides that the issues for consideration by the relevant House of Parliament in relation to any nomination shall be—
- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;*
 - (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and*
 - (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee’s abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.*
25. While conducting the approval hearing, the Committee was guided by the provisions of section 6(7) and (8) and section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F.

2.8.1 Procedure for Nomination

26. Section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H provides that the Commission shall, through an open, transparent and competitive recruitment process, and with the approval of the National Assembly, appoint a suitably qualified person to be the Secretary to the Commission.
27. Section 5(1) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F further requires the appointing authority, upon nominating any person for appointment, to notify the relevant House of Parliament.
28. In compliance with the aforementioned provisions, the EACC notified the National Assembly of the nomination of a person for appointment as the Secretary to the Commission.

2.8.2 Constitutional and Statutory Requirements

29. The Committee was guided by the following provisions of law on the requirements for appointment to the public office:

i. National Values and Principles of Governance

30. Article 10 of the Constitution provides for the national values and principles of governance which State officers must abide by in discharging their mandate. They include: patriotism; national unity; sharing and devolution of power; the rule of law; democracy and participation of the people; human dignity; equity; social justice; inclusiveness; equality; human rights; non-discrimination and protection of the marginalized; good governance; integrity; transparency and accountability; and sustainable development.

ii. Conduct of State Officers

31. Article 75 of the Constitution requires a State Officer, whether in public or private life to behave in a manner that avoids conflict between personal interest and public official duties. This Article further prohibits a State Officer who has been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of provisions of Chapter Six of the Constitution from holding any other State office.

32. Article 77 of the Constitution outlines that a full-time State officer must not participate in any other gainful employment and that any appointed State officer must not hold office in a political party.
33. Moreover, the Constitution under Article 78 further stipulates that a State officer must not hold dual citizenship but instead shall be a citizen of Kenya only.
34. Article 232 provides for the values and principles of public service as: high standards of professional ethics; efficient, effective and economic use of resources; responsive, prompt, effective, impartial and equitable provision of services; involvement of the people in the process of policy-making; accountability for administrative acts; transparency and provision to the public of timely, accurate information; fair competition and merit as the basis of appointments and promotions; representation of Kenya's diverse communities; and affording adequate and equal opportunities for appointment, training and advancement, at all levels of the public service of men and women, members of all ethnic groups and persons with disabilities.
35. The Public Officer Ethics Act, Cap 185B outlines the obligations of a public officer as: professionalism; carrying out duties in accordance with the law; prohibition from unjust enrichment; avoiding conflict of interest; not using the office as an avenue for soliciting or collecting *harambees*; not acting for foreigners; care of property; political neutrality, not practising nepotism or favouritism; giving impartial advice; conducting private affairs in a way that maintains public confidence; not engaging in sexual harassment; and submission of a declaration of income, assets and liabilities once every two years.

iii. Qualifications for Appointment as Secretary to the EACC

36. Section 16(2) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H provides for the qualifications of the Secretary to the Commission as follows:

"A person shall be qualified for appointment as the Secretary of the Commission if the person—

- (a) is a citizen of Kenya;*
- (b) possesses a postgraduate degree from a university recognised in Kenya;*
- (c) has had at least ten proven experience at management level;*
- (d) has experience in any of the following fields—*
 - (i) ethics and governance;*
 - (ii) law;*
 - (iii) public administration;*
 - (iv) leadership;*
 - (v) economics;*
 - (vi) social studies;*
 - (vii) audit;*
 - (viii) accounting*
 - (ix) fraud investigation;*
 - (x) public relations and media; or*
 - (xi) religious studies or philosophy;*
- (e) meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution."*

iv. Leadership and Integrity

37. The Committee, in determining the suitability of the nominee, was also guided by the provisions on leadership and integrity as outlined under Chapter Six of the Constitution. In particular, Article 73(2) of the Constitution provides that the guiding principles of leadership and integrity include –
- a) selection on the basis of personal integrity, competence and suitability, or election in free and fair elections;
 - b) objectivity and impartiality in decision making, and in ensuring that decisions are not influenced by nepotism, favouritism, other improper motives or corrupt practices;
 - c) selfless service based solely on the public interest, demonstrated by —
 - i) honesty in the execution of public duties; and
 - ii) the declaration of any personal interest that may conflict with public duties.
 - d) accountability to the public for decisions and actions; and
 - e) discipline and commitment in service to the people.
38. In addition, the Committee considered section 10 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, Cap 185C which provides that –
- “A State officer shall, to the best of their ability—*
- (a) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;*
 - (b) carry out the duties in a transparent and accountable manner;*
 - (c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and*
 - (d) report truthfully on all matters of the organization which they represent.”*

2.8.3 Suitability of the nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominee’s abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made

39. The suitability of the nominee was assessed after scrutiny of the nominee’s academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity, background and qualities as well as his performance during the approval hearing conducted on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024.

CHAPTER THREE

3 APPROVAL HEARING OF NOMINEE

40. The Committee held a sitting on Tuesday, 3rd November 2024 to deliberate on the approval hearing and noted the following—
- 1) The nominee had not notified the Clerk of the National Assembly of their withdrawal from the approval process as outlined in section 6(10) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F.
 - 2) The shortlisting and nomination process conducted by the EACC adhered to section 16 of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
 - 3) The Committee had received two memoranda from Mr. Eliud Karanja Matindi and Dr. Magare Gikenyi Benjamin which it considered and found that they do not contest the suitability of the nominee for appointment but challenge the constitutionality of section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
 - 4) The Committee would therefore proceed with the approval hearing on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 in accordance with section 16(1) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
 - 5) The Committee would examine the nominee against the criteria set out in section 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F.

3.1 Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud – Nominee to the Office of Secretary to the EACC

41. Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud appeared before the Committee on Tuesday, 3rd December 2024 at 9.00 am and was vetted under oath to examine his suitability or otherwise. The Committee noted the following:

Date and place of Birth

42. The nominee is a male Kenyan citizen of Identification Card Number 7128098 and does not hold any other citizenship. He was born on 12th June 1966 in Garissa County.

Academic and Professional Qualifications

43. The nominee is an Advocate of the High Court of Kenya having been admitted to the bar on 23rd November 2023 and holds a Master of Science in Security and Risk Management from the University of Leicester in the United Kingdom, a Postgraduate Diploma in Law from the Kenya School of Law, and a Bachelor of Laws from Mount Kenya University. He also holds a Diploma in Contemporary Public Administration Management from Galilee International Management Institute in Israel.

Work and Professional Experience

44. The nominee has worked in the following capacities, as a—
- a) Deputy CEO and Director Investigation of the EACC from 2012 to 2022;
 - b) Regional Manager, Coast Region and Senior Officer, Rapid Response of the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission from 2005 to 2012; and
 - c) Cadet Inspector to Senior Superintendent of Police in various Stations, Divisions and Formation of the Kenya Police Service from 1999 to 2005.

Honours and Awards

45. The nominee indicated that he was conferred the Moran of the Burning Spear (MBS) in December 2016.

Income and Net Worth

46. The nominee estimated his net worth to be Ksh. 130 million comprising immovable property, livestock, motor vehicles and cash in bank. He indicated his sources of income to be salary and personal emoluments from the EACC and rental income.

Professional Associations and Memberships

47. The nominee indicated that he is a member of the LSK and Karen Country Club.

Potential Conflict of Interest

48. The nominee declared that he is currently not associated with any persons or matters that would present a potential conflict of interest should he assume the position of the Secretary of the EACC.

Public Office, Political Activities and Affiliations

49. The nominee indicated that he is currently the Deputy CEO of the EACC and has previously served as a Director of Investigations of the EACC.

Integrity

50. The nominee demonstrated integrity. He has not been charged in a court of law or mentioned in any investigatory reports of Parliament or any Commission of Inquiry in the last three (3) years. Further, he has never been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution.

3.1.1 General and Sector-Specific Questions to the Nominee

51. The Committee posed several questions to the nominee on his suitability for appointment as Secretary to the EACC. The nominee responded as follows:

On his management capabilities

52. The nominee indicated that he has undertaken several managerial trainings locally at various institutions including the Kenya School of Government. He also stated that he has undertaken international trainings by the Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI), at Galilee International Management Institute in Israel and in Singapore. He indicated that these trainings are equivalent to leadership courses offered by the Kenya School of Government.

On restoring public confidence in the EACC

53. The nominee submitted that the eroded public trust of the Commission is purely a perception attributed to information available to the public on social media. It was his submission that the Commission has achieved a lot such as recovery of over Ksh. 4 billion per year. He added that, if approved, he would leverage social media platforms to educate the public on the Commission's mandates and its achievements to improve public perception of the Commission.
54. He also noted the high level of corruption in the country and indicated that he would strive to improve the relationship between the EACC and the ODPP to ensure successful prosecution of offenders, if approved. It was his view that this would restore public trust in the Commission's mandate to fight corruption.

On his new strategies to curb corruption

55. The nominee submitted that to effectively cure a problem, one has to ably understand it. Being an employee of the Commission, he noted that he understands the weaknesses and challenges of the Commission and would therefore be best placed to address them. In addition, he submitted that if approved, his first assignment would be to engage with the ODPP to explore viable mechanisms for collaboration.
56. The nominee submitted that he would leverage on ICT and social media such as *X Spaces* to educate the youth and the general public on the Commission's mandate, if approved. Moreover, he indicated that the Commission would engage the younger generation in primary schools on matters ethics and to instil a sense of patriotism at an early stage.
57. The nominee further submitted that he would create strategic partnerships to strengthen the fight against corruption, if approved.

On collaboration with the ODPP in prosecuting corruption cases

58. Citing Article 157 of the Constitution, the nominee stated that prosecutorial powers are a preserve of the ODPP while the mandate of investigations of corruption cases is vested with the EACC. Relating to the conduct of investigations at the EACC, the nominee reported that there is a robust investigation process handled by competent officers trained in both law and investigations.
59. However, it was his view that some proposals can be made to ensure the successful prosecution of corruption cases. For instance, gazettelement of EACC Advocates as prosecutors to assist the ODPP in prosecuting certain complex cases. In his view, this would ensure that the prosecuting team has the necessary support from the EACC considering that the investigation lawyers are also part of the prosecuting teams.
60. Noting that the request for gazettelement of EACC Advocates as prosecutors had been declined in the past, he informed the Committee that he was open to engaging the ODPP for concurrence. He added that if approved, he would seek the support of the Committee to come up with viable modalities for effective collaboration with the ODPP.

On enforcing Chapter Six of the Constitution especially vetting of State officers

61. The nominee was of the view that the Leadership and Integrity Act, Cap 185C requires further amendments to enhance the fight against corruption. He submitted that, if approved, he would engage the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs to come up with the necessary amendments.

On his milestone achievements during his time at the EACC

62. The nominee highlighted some of his achievements to include the development of a standard procedure on investigations at the EACC, and the establishment of the National Integrity Academy. In consultation with the Kenya School of Government, he ensured the successful transition of the National Integrity Academy to a fully-fledged institute. He added that the Academy conducts capacity building programs for legislators across the region and encouraged Kenyan Members of Parliament to enroll for some of the courses.

On how he would handle disagreements with the Chairperson of the Commission on policy issues

63. The nominee stated that he would be guided by the EACC Act, Cap 7H and in the event of a dispute would give dialogue a chance and if need be, seek the intervention of the Departmental Committee on Justice and Legal Affairs.

On wanting to be in the EACC despite its poor public perception

64. The nominee submitted that he is committed to serving the country to reduce the level of corruption. He urged the Committee that Kenyans should not give up on the fight against corruption no matter how difficult the task may seem.

On lessons learnt from previous holders of the office

65. The nominee confirmed that some former CEOs of the EACC did not complete their terms. He attributed this to different reasons including personal choice and internal conflicts between Commissioners and the Secretariat. It was his view that the internal conflicts have since been resolved by making the Commissioner's term of office part-time.

On whether the nominee was politically-aligned

66. The nominee confirmed that he does not belong to any political party and has never been in any. He submitted that he has always been in law enforcement having served in the National Police Service and later in the EACC, both of which are independent bodies. He committed to upholding his independence and impartiality throughout his term as Secretary to the Commission, if approved.

On weaponization of the EACC to settle political scores

67. The nominee affirmed that throughout his time at the EACC, the Commission has never been involved in the alleged weaponization. He stated that the Commission has, at all times, been guided by the facts, evidence and the law in investigating all cases. Elaborating a robust investigation process, he submitted that cases cannot be interfered with by external forces. It was his submission that, if approved, he would not succumb to any undue influence.

3.1.2 Committee Observations on the Suitability of the Nominee

68. The Committee having considered the nominee's filled questionnaire pursuant to section 6(8) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F and section 16 of the EACC Act, Cap 7H, curriculum vitae and having heard his oral submission during the approval hearing, made the following observations on his suitability for appointment as the Secretary to the EACC—

Constitutional and Statutory Requirements

- 1) The nominee is a Kenyan citizen and does not hold any other citizenship and therefore meets the requirement of Article 78(1) of the Constitution and section 16(2)(a) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
- 2) The nominee possesses a postgraduate degree, Master of Science in Security and Risk Management from the University of Leicester in the United Kingdom and was issued with a letter of recognition by CUE referenced *CHE/10/9/1Vol.149* dated 12th March 2013. Having been cleared by the CUE, he meets the requirements of section 16(2)(b) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
- 3) The nominee has over ten years' proven experience at management level having served in different managerial capacities at the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission and the EACC, including as a Regional Manager, Acting CEO, Director and Deputy CEO from August 2008 to date. The nominee, therefore, meets the requirements of section 16(2)(c) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.

CHAPTER FOUR

4 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

69. Pursuant to sections 6(7) and (8) and 7 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F, the Committee observed that—

(a) Procedure for Nomination

- 1) The nominee was selected following an open, transparent and competitive recruitment process in accordance with the provisions of section 16(1) and (6) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.

(b) Constitutional and Statutory Requirements

- 2) The nominee has satisfied all the constitutional and statutory requirements including those on citizenship; leadership, ethics and integrity; tax compliance; and higher education loan repayments.

(c) Suitability of the nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made

- 3) The nominee has demonstrated a deep understanding of the affairs of the EACC and the respective roles of the Secretary to the Commission. He possesses the requisite abilities, academic qualifications and professional experience required for a person nominated to serve as the Secretary to the EACC.

- 4) The nominee has experience in various fields including ethics and governance, law, public administration and fraud investigation thereby meets the requirements of section 16(2)(d) of the EACC act, Cap 7H.
- 5) The nominee demonstrated an aspiration for integrity in public service and thus meets the requirements of Chapter Six of the Constitution on leadership and integrity and section 16(2)(e) of the EACC Act, Cap 7H.
- 6) The nominee, having been cleared by EACC, ODPP, ORPP and CUE with regard to ethics and integrity, active criminal court proceedings, political party affiliations and authenticity of academic certificates has met the statutory requirements for appointment as the Secretary to the EACC.
- 7) The Clerk of the National Assembly invited members of the public to submit memoranda on the nominee pursuant to section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap. 7F. Noting that the two memoranda received were not contesting the suitability or otherwise of the nominee, the Committee finds that the nominee is suitable to hold the office to which he is nominated.

Suitability of the nominee for the proposed appointment having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which the nomination is made

- 8) The nominee exhibited a deep understanding of the position of the Secretary to the EACC. He identified various challenges and innovative ways of improving the operations of the Commission such as leveraging strategic partnerships in to strengthen the fight against corruption.
- 9) The nominee demonstrated excellent managerial skills having served undertaken various courses in leadership and governance at the Kenya School of Government. He also has vast international exposure which he acquired from various trainings by the FBI, at Galilee International Management Institute in Israel and in Singapore.
- 10) The nominee displayed good problem-solving and innovative skills. He developed the EACC Guide to Investigations and was instrumental in the establishment of the National Integrity Academy in consultation with the Kenya School of Government. This also demonstrates his collaborative skills, attributes important for any persons discharging the role of CEO of the EACC.


CHAPTER FIVE

5 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

70. Having considered the approval hearing for the nominee pursuant to Article 250(12) of the Constitution, section 16 of the EACC Act, Cap 7H and sections 3 and 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, Cap 7F, the Committee recommends that the National Assembly **approves** the appointment of **Mr. Abdi Ahmed Mohamud** to the Office of **Secretary of the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission**.

Additionally, he noted that he will not be used as a conveyor belt and that all the decisions will be determined as per the law and the evidence gathered.

f) On new strategies

1. The nominee stated that if approved, he will ensure that there is better relationship between the Commission and the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions to ensure effective and efficient service delivery to the people of Kenya.
2. The nominee assured the Committee that there will be more collaboration between the Commission and the members of the public in order for the public to understand how the Commission works. He also added that this could be realized in many ways including having more engagements with the youth on social media platforms to spread awareness across the country.
3. He informed the Committee that he will be keen on creating more strategic partnerships in his strategies in the fight against corruption.





years of his first term before seeking re-election.

The Head of State vowed to continue working with leaders and people across the country, saying that was the only way to realise development without a section of the country feeling left out.

He stated that he will continue to unite the country under the broad-based government to build a strong nation.

The President also reiterated his support for the Azimio leadership even as he seeks to become the

Chairperson of the African Union Commission.

"I promised that I will hold his (Raila) hand, pray and support his bid. As we speak, he is out of the country and has been campaigning in Ivory Coast, Senegal and today he is in Nigeria seeking to be the chairman of the AUC. Let us continue praying for him," said Dr Ruto.

He was with leaders from the region, including Governors Anyang Nyong'o (Kisumu), James Orengo (Siaya), Gladys Wanga (Homa Bay) and MPs Dr Joshua Oron (Kisumu Central), James Koyoo (Muhoroni), Samuel Atandi (Alego Usonga), Felix Jalang'o (Liangata) and Kisumu Senator Tom Ojenda.

The leaders from the Nyanza region expressed their gratitude for the support Dr Ruto was giving Mr Odinga.

During the conference, held by the African Export-Import Bank (Afreximbank), Dr Ruto stated that the process of constructing 10 landing sites in Lake Victoria will commence in January 2025.

He expressed confidence that the Sh300 million project will bridge the demand-supply gap and reduce over-reliance on imports.

"It is a big shame for us to import fish from Asia in this 21st century, 60 years after independence," he said.

The landing sites will cover the five counties surrounding Lake Victoria, including Busia, Siaya, Kisumu, Homa Bay and Migori.

The sites will be in Ogal (Kisumu), Asat (Kisumu), Nyandhiwa (Homa Bay), Nyakula (Homa Bay), Mainuga (Homa Bay), Got Kochola (Migori), Sori (Migori), Gumbe (Busia) as well as Wichlun and Asembo in Siaya county.

President Ruto revealed that the project bids will be out in January next year ahead of the ground-breaking.

He stated that the sites will be equipped with ultra-modern facilities to support fisher folk and other players in the fish value chain.

"Unlike the traditional way of fishing where people catch and sell immediately the sites will act as aggregation centres and will have enough cold storage facilities to store the fish as they look for markets," he said.

The Head of State also said that the construction of Kabonyo Kanyagwal Fisheries and Aquaculture Research Centre will kick off in January.

"The Kabonyo Kanyagwal fish facility will provide seven million fingerlings every year for supply locally as well as the entire East African region," he said.

On the other hand, he stated that sugar cane farmers have realised a bumper harvest such

that for the first time, the country is not going to import from other countries.

"This is the route we want to take where we produce enough food to make Kenya food secure," said Dr Ruto.


While addressing the locals at Kondele, the President said the government will bring back the 'Kazi Mtaani' initiative in Kisumu in January next year following a request by the Dr Oron.

Dr Ruto assured Governor Nyong'o that he will ensure that projects on affordable housing, sugar industry and fisheries in the county are completed on time.

He also drummed up support for the Social Health Insurance Fund, saying the universal cover will ensure that the government pays for those who cannot afford health care services in hospitals.

Raila came through for me, Ruto says as he charms Kisumu City

President gets warm reception for second time since forming broad-based government

President William Ruto has publicly acknowledged Raila Odinga's support, saying his former arch-rival came through for him as he received a warm welcome in Kisumu.

Without details on the kind of support received, the head of state said he will work with Raila to unite Kenya.

"Raila and I agreed (to work together). You know there was a time I helped Raila and this time round he has helped me, why should anyone find a problem with that?" Ruto posed while addressing a mammoth crowd in Kondele.

This was the first time since the youth-led nationwide protests that most toppled his administration in June that Ruto admitted to Raila's support.

Without naming names, the President told off politicians who were "spreading tribalism and division",

saying they had "no space in the new Kenya".

"I stood here in Kondele some time back and said we will work together to unite Kenya. Those who promote division, hatred and tribalism will be shown the way to go home."

Residents thronged the street, holding banners and cheering as the President made his way to Kondele, the political heartbeat of the lake-side city.

The area has in the past been volatile towards Ruto, owing to the political differences that existed between him and Raila.

But since they closed ranks, the region has expressed solidarity with President Ruto.

As the President's convoy made its way, Ruto was flanked by a charged crowd that appeared excited to see him - giving him a heroic reception for the second time since the formation of the broad-based government.

Ruto was in Kisumu for the opening of the fourth Africa Sub-Sovereign Network Conference being held at the Swiss Grand Royal Hotel.

Ruto reiterated his administration's commitment to back Raila in his Africa Union Commission bid, saying he will "pull all strings" to ensure the former Premier is successful.

"We support Raila's bid to become the AU chair. Let us pray for his success as he seeks votes across the continent," Ruto said.

While addressing a crowd in Kisumu, the President

appealed to Kenyans to set aside divisions based on ethnicity, hatred and regionalism and work towards a united and prosperous Kenya.

It is time for the nation to come together and move beyond tribalism and segregation, he added.

He reaffirmed that his government is for all Kenyans, saying no Kenyan, no matter their background or location, should be left behind in the journey of national development.

"This is a broad-based government and we will ensure no one is left behind. We must move forward as one nation, united for progress," he said.


The government's mission is to ensure that all regions benefit from progress, with opportunities for employment, healthcare and economic development.

Ruto also outlined key areas of focus for the government.

"We will invest in agriculture to reduce the cost of living. We are also focusing on Universal Health Coverage so that every Kenyan can access healthcare, regardless of their financial status. Affordable housing will be built, especially for the youth, to create jobs and promote economic growth."

He praised the work done by Community Health Promoters, noting that they now number 108,000.

Accompanying the President were Interior PS Raymond Omolo, governor Anyang' Nyong'o, Treasury CS John Mbadia, Governors Ken Lusaka (Bungoma), James Orengo (Stara), and Gladys Wanga (Homa Bay).
