REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1962

Review of the Year

The overall volume of work dealt with by the Department during the year varied little from that of the previous year, but it is encouraging to record that the number of new bankruptcies coming forward for administration during the year dropped to the extremely low figure of 32. This number is the lowest in the last decade and when compared with the 1960 and 1961 figures of 125 and 119 respectively may well be indicative of an improvement in trading conditions. The reduction in fresh insolvency work, which enabled arrears of work in connexion with existing cases to be disposed of, was balanced by an increase in the work of other sections, e.g. in the registries of births and deaths, business names and trade marks.

2. The chief points of interest connected with the multifarious activities of the Department are given in the succeeding paragraphs. At the end of the Report are set out Appendices which give statistics covering the more important subjects and provide comparative figures over the last decade.

Companies Section

3. The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

4. The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 233 compared with 271 in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies together with increases of capital of existing companies, however, showed a substantial increase with a total of £9,470,000 compared with £5,931,813 in 1961.

5. There were 46 foreign companies registered and 20 such companies removed from the register during the year.

6. There were 4,442 locally incorporated companies on the register at 31st December, 1962 of which 282 were public and 4,160 were private. The number of foreign companies on the register stood at 610 at the end of the year showing an increase of 26 compared with the previous year.

7. Of the new companies incorporated in the year, 34 per cent of these were effected by the European community, 60 per cent by the Asian community, 4 per cent by the African community and 2 per cent by European and Asian. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 39 per cent, Asian 49 per cent, African 7 per cent, European and Asian 5 per cent.

8. With the introduction of the new Companies Ordinance on 1st January, 1962, companies legislation was brought into line with that of Uganda, both being based broadly on the Companies Act, 1948 of the United Kingdom. One important feature of the new Ordinance is the introduction of late registration fees for the filing of returns outside the prescribed periods and it is of interest to observe that by the end of the year there was a noticeable reduction in the number of returns in arrear. Late registration fees alone accounted for almost £4,000 of the revenue received from the companies registration section. The purpose of introducing this fee was, however, to encourage the filing of returns within the time limits prescribed so that the public might obtain up-to-date information of any company on the register. It is hoped, therefore, that this particular revenue will fall away as more and more companies perceive the disadvantages of any laxity in filing returns within the prescribed period.

Business Names

9. Registrations of new business names were slightly up with 1,215 compared with 1,195 in 1961 but the number of registered changes in particulars of existing businesses remained almost the same with 550 compared with 549 in the previous year. There were 200 business names removed from the register during the year leaving a total of 20,600 businesses on the register at the end of the year.

Chattels Transfers

10. The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfer increased by over £900,000, the total amount borrowed being £2,634,829. There were 1,559 new instruments and 1,429 satisfactions.

Patents

11. The number of new patent registrations during the year fell to 83 which, although well above the average, was a considerable drop compared with a figure of 112 registrations in the previous year. A patent normally lapses at the expiration of 16 years unless any extension is granted. As at the end of the year there were 790 live patents on the register.

Trade Marks

12. New applications and registrations were higher than in the previous year with 670 applications and 737 registrations being effected during the year. There were 8,622 trade marks on the register at 31st December, 1962.

Births, Deaths, Marriages and Naturalization Registration Section

13. This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of births and deaths and of marriages (including his duties as such under the Adoption and Legitimacy Ordinances). It also carries out registration work in connexion with naturalization.

VITAL STATISTICS

14. Current registrations of non-African births during the year totalled 7,457 compared with 8,162 in 1961, reflecting a decrease of 705. Late registrations were higher than in the previous year with a total of 1,812 compared with 1,654 in 1961. With an approximate non-African population of 270,873 in August, 1962 the birth-rate level is approximately 27.6 per thousand.

15. The total of non-African deaths registered in the Colony, excluding late registrations, was 1,666 representing a crude death rate of 6.1 per thousand, based on an estimated population of 270,873.

16. The registration of African deaths rose from 5,093 to 6,922. This large increase is due not to any rapid increase in the death rate amongst the Africans but to the fact that in July, 1962 the registration of deaths in Nairobi was transferred from the district administration to the Funerals Office of the Department of the Medical Officer of Health of Nairobi City Council which made it possible to register many more African deaths from medical certificates received from hospitals.

17. During the year, the United Nations seconded a Civil Registration Adviser to advise on the possibility of setting up a compulsory system of registration of births and deaths for all races and, at the end of the year, plans were well in hand for a sample registration project in Nairobi and three other districts. When the project is completed in 1964, it will be possible to ascertain whether compulsory registration for all races in all or most districts of Kenya will be practicable.

18. The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the intermediate list of the International Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths (1,369) were under the class "ill-defined and unknown causes of morbidity and mortality", followed by broncho-pneumonia (757) and gastro-enteritis and colitis (567).

MARRIAGES

19. The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Ordinance and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Ordinance amounted to 6,126 reflecting a sharp decrease of 3,053 accounted for by a decrease in marriages celebrated under the latter Ordinance.

NATURALIZATION

20. The Registrar-General maintains a register of all certificates of naturalization which are issued in Kenya under the British Nationality Act, 1948. He is also responsible for preparing and sending to the Secretary of State for the Colonies lists of persons registered as citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies under the same Act. During the year, 3,015 persons were so registered. As a result of the passing of the South Africa Act, 1962, the Registrar-General became responsible for recording particulars of citizens of the Republic of South Africa who had given notice of intention to apply for registration as citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies.

Public Trustee Section

21. This section carries out the administration of deceased estates under the Public Trustee Ordinance and the management of trusts accepted under such Ordinance. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered either because there is no heir who is prepared or is available to apply for letters of administration or because the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator but in such cases the consent of the Public Trustee is required at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, firstly, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole, and, secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not therefore subject to rapid change.

22. The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Ordinance, Cap. 248, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.

23. The number of estates accepted for administration during the year was 545 making an increase of 109 over the previous year, and the number of estates finalized and distributed was up by 51 compared with 1961 with a total of 502 for the year. The gross value of all estates distributed in 1962 was £106,975. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December, 1962, may be found at Appendix XXXIII.

Bankruptcy and Companies Liquidation Section

24. This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of deeds of arrangement.

25. After the all-time record high number of bankruptcies in 1960 (125) and 1961 (119) the position was completely reversed in 1962 with 32 bankruptcies—the lowest figure since 1952. Even more encouraging was the fact that the average deficiency was well below the averages of previous years.

26. This year farmers provided the highest number of new bankruptcies with nine cases compared with six in the previous year followed by shopkeepers and traders with seven new cases compared with 55 in 1961. Most fraudulent bankruptcies are found in the latter category and it may well be that the vigorous campaign of investigations and prosecutions which was in full swing during 1961 has had the desired effect on those who considered availing themselves of the protection of bankruptcy.

27. Only one winding-up order was made during the year as compared with a figure of 14 in the previous year. Details of assets and liabilities of companies in compulsory liquidation are given at Appendix XXIII.

Deeds of Arrangement

28. There were five new deeds of arrangement registered in which the total assets were shown as £16,029, liabilities as £27,894 and a total estimated deficiency of £16,376.

General

29. Despite the fall in the number of new bankruptcies there was still a heavy pressure of work on the officers of the section in dealing with the large number of complicated bankruptcies which arose in 1960 and 1961, some of which are still the subject of detailed investigation.

30. With the decline in the bankruptcy rate it was possible to give more attention to the work of distributing the assets in estates by way of dividend. Assets realized and contributions by debtors produced a total of £128,194 and dividends paid to creditors during the period totalled £56,066.

Bankruptcy Contingency Fund

31. The Income and Expenditure Account for the year 1962 and a Balance Sheet as at 31st December, 1962 are set out at Appendix XX and Appendix XXI respectively.

Banks, Building Societies, Insurance Companies and Estate Duty

BANKS

32. During the year to 31st December, 1962, two new banks were registered in Kenya namely:—

- (a) The Commercial Bank of Africa, a company incorporated in Tanganyika which commenced its banking operations in Kenya on 1st July, 1962; and
- (b) The First Permanent (East Africa) Ltd., a subsidiary of the Colonial Development Corporation, which took over the assets and liabilities in East African territories of the former First Permanent Building Society on 1st July, 1962.

33. Lombard Banking (Kenya) Ltd., ceased its banking operations on 30th June, 1962, and, although remaining on the companies register for purposes of terminal transactions, was exempted from the provisions of the Banking Ordinance as from 1st July, 1962.

34. At 31st December, 1962, the total number of banks licensed under the Banking Ordinance to continue banking operations was 21. Details of incorporation of these banks were as follows:—

Statistics of the operations of commercial banks in Kenya are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and in the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is, therefore, considered unnecessary to reproduce them here.

BUILDING SOCIETIES

35. No new building societies were registered during the year but the Rhodesian First Permanent Building Society passed over its East African assets and liabilities at 30th June, 1952 to the First Permanent (East Africa) Ltd., a subsidiary company of the Colonial Development Corporation, in which the Kenya and Tanganyika Governments hold Preference Share Capital, and appear as loan creditors. The new Company's operations are not now controlled by the Building Societies Ordinance but the Company is obliged to comply with the provisions of the Banking Ordinance (Cap. 488).

36. Statistics relating to building societies are set out in Appendix XXIX.

INSURANCE COMPANIES

37. At 31st December, 1962 there were 107 insurers licensed to conduct insurance business in Kenya—11 fewer than in the previous year—and one insurer was granted exemption from the provisions of the Ordinance under section 47 thereof.

38. Two applications for the issue of licences—one from an American company and the other from a United Kingdom company—were received late in the year and the formalities of examination had not been completed before 31st December. In the case of one other insurer the issue of a licence was still under consideration at the close of the year.

39. Statistics showing the countries of origin of insurers and the classes of insurance business which they conduct may be found at Appendix XXX.

ESTATE DUTY

40. This section is now only concerned with outstanding cases which have occurred prior to 29th April, 1959 and the figures shown in Appendix XXVII, therefore, cannot serve as a basis of comparison with the information given in previous years' reports.

41. It will be observed from the Appendix that the net income in respect of Estate Duty for the year 1962 was £114,020, as compared with a sum of £3,593 in 1961. A major portion of the revenue was collected from estates where duty had been re-assessed including the estate of H.H. The Aga Khan, deceased.

42. New estates or estates not previously assessed show an aggregate net value of £64,081, but the duty assessed thereon amounted to £468 only. The majority of these cases were exempted from the provisions of the Estate Duty Ordinance since their net value in each case was below the minimum dutiable figure of £5,000.

Trade Unions

43. At the end of the year there were 72 trade unions on the register comprising 53 employees' and 19 employers' trade unions. The employees' trade unions consisted of 27 with African members, seven with Asian, six with European and 13 with mixed membership; whilst employers' unions consisted of seven with European and Asian members, one with European, one with Asian, one with African and nine with mixed membership. During the year seven new unions were registered—five of which were employees' unions and two were employers' unions. The names of three employees' unions were removed from the register, two unions having been dissolved and the registration of the third being cancelled under the provisions of section 17 (1) (b) of the Trade Unions Ordinance on the grounds that it had ceased to exist. Of the unions which were dissolved the National Union of Journalists (East Africa Branch) was reconstituted with an enlarged field of representation and was subsequently re-registered as the Kenya Union of Journalists. The second union, namely the Sisal Plantation Workers' Union, was re-formed to represent the interests of the workers employed both on coffee and sisal plantations and was re-registered under the name of Sisal and Coffee Plantation Workers' Union. As the new union thereby represented the interests of the workers formerly represented by the Coffee Plantation Workers'

Union, the registration of that union was cancelled. Two employers' and one employees' union changed their names during the year and these changes were duly registered. These unions, however, by reason of the change of name did not enlarge their field of representation.

44. During the year applications for registration from six trade unions were refused. None of these unions, however, appealed against the Registrar's decision. These unions comprised break-away factions of unions which were already registered, one of which consisted of employers, the rest being those of employees.

45. During the year inspections of books of account of 78 trade unions were carried out, 22 of these being of head office accounts and 56 of branch accounts. Inspections of accounts were carried out at Nairobi, Mombasa, Nakuru and Kisumu. The implementation of the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations has resulted in a marked improvement in the standard of accounting at most trade union head offices and to a lesser degree at branch level. Resulting from inspections which were carried out, two treasurers were prosecuted for failing to maintain the accounts in accordance with the provisions of the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations. In one case a fine of Sh. 80 was imposed and in the second case a fine of Sh. 150 was imposed. Three treasurers of trade unions were prosecuted for failing to render accounts when requested to do so, two prosecutions resulted in fines of Sh. 100 being imposed and in the third case, the treasurer was sentenced to 28 days' imprisonment. A detailed investigation was carried out by the Department into the financial affairs of the East Africa Federation of Building and Construction Workers' Union. The general secretary of the union was subsequently prosecuted and convicted on five counts involving theft and is now serving a total of eleven months' imprisonment.

46. Details of the book and voting membership of the various trade unions on the register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by the Annual Returns are set out in Appendix XXVIII hereto.

Societies, Books and Newspapers Section

47. This section deals with registration under the Societies Ordinance and the Books and Newspapers Ordinance.

SOCIETIES

48. At the end of the year there were 2,145 registered societies and 946 societies which were exempted from registration.

49. There was a substantial increase in the volume of work during the year. 532 new registrations were effected as against 384 in 1961 and 123 societies were exempted as against 114 in 1961. 42 societies were refused registration, four had their registration cancelled, and 432 ceased to be registered as they had ceased to exist. The racial breakdown of the 532 societies registered was: African 427, Asian 8, European 5, multiracial 75, Somali 9, Arab 5, Sudanese 1, Seychellois 1 and Ethiopian 1.

50. Twenty-three new political societies were registered of which 14 were African (plus 46 branches), one was Asian, one was European, six were multiracial, one was Ethiopian, whilst eight were branches of a Somali Society and two were branches of an Arab Society.

51. Most of the work of the section is concerned with revising and in many cases assisting in redrafting the constitutions of new societies applying for membership. The chairman, vice-chairman and treasurer of a society were prosecuted and convicted for failing to produce audited accounts to the Registrar after having been ordered to do so.

BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS

52. At the end of the year there were 56 newspapers and 157 books registered. The printer of one newspaper was prosecuted and convicted for failing to submit a bond to the Registrar. During the year, arrangements were made for a copy of each registered book and newspaper to be deposited in the library of the Royal College, Nairobi.

Accounts and Establishment Section

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

53. Fees collected by the Department in respect of its various services totalled £69,565. A further £114,020 was collected as Estate Duty and miscellaneous revenue produced £1,111 thus giving a total departmental revenue of £184,696. The total expenditure of the Department on personal emoluments and other charges was £62,771.

54. A statement showing the various investments, deposits and cash balances held by the Registrar-General in his various capacities as at the beginning and end of the year will be found at Appendix XXXIII. Immovable property and personal effects of estates under administration in the Department are excluded from the statement.

ESTABLISHMENT

55. The establishment of professional officers in addition to the Registrar- and Deputy Registrar-General remained unchanged with five Assistant Registrars-General and one professional adviser on accounts.
