REPORT OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL FOR THE YEAR 1963

Review of the Year

Despite the constitutional changes which occurred during the year, most of the work of the Department continued its even tenor. The Births, Deaths and Marriages Registry was most radically affected by the changes as the function of registration is now shared between Central Government and the Regions. The Registry also was fully committed during the second half of the year by the demand for birth certificates by persons applying for British passports, together with a demand for similar certificates by persons, not previously registered, who wished to acquire Kenya passports.

During the year the Registrar-General assumed the mantle of Registrar of Mohammedan Marriages and Divorces to add to his other functions under some 25 different Acts. After some months, however, the duties were passed to the Chief Kathi at Mombasa by whom it was considered they could more appropriately be performed.

There was also an increase during the year in the work of the Custodian of Enemy Property, whose duties had seemed to have died a natural death some years ago. The increased work arose from the inauguration of a compensation scheme in Germany and the verification of these claims through its diplomatic representatives in Kenya.

However, the downward trend in bankruptcy continued and reached the remarkably low figure of 36 for the year, although signs are present that this is the bottom of the graph. With the steady growth in the number of trading concerns in the country, it would be surprising if there was not also some increase in the annual rate of insolvencies in the future.

Companies Section

The section comprises the registries of Companies, Business Names, Limited Partnerships, Trade Marks, Patents and Chattels Transfers.

The number of new companies, both public and private, incorporated during the year was 360 compared with 233 in the previous year. The amount of nominal capital of new companies, together with increases of capital of existing companies, showed a substantial increase with a total of £12,404,030 compared with £9,470,000 in 1962.

There were 42 foreign companies registered and 28 such companies removed from the register during the year.

There were 5,005 locally incorporated companies on the register at 31st December 1963, of which 288 were public and 4,717 were private. The number of foreign companies on the register stood at 624 at the end of the year, showing an increase of 14 compared with the previous year.

Of the new companies incorporated in the year, 44 per cent of these were effected by the European community, 42 per cent by the Asian community, 5 per cent by the African community and 9 per cent by European, Asian and African. The corresponding figures for the previous year were European 34 per cent, Asian 60 per cent, African 4 per cent, and European and Asian 2 per cent.

Business Names

Registration of new business names were slightly up with 1,408 compared with 1,215 in 1962, but the number of registered changes in particulars of existing businesses was 456 compared with 550 in the previous year. There were 120 business names removed from the register during the year, leaving a total of 27,010 on the register at the end of the year.

Chattels Transfer

The volume of borrowing on security by way of chattels transfer increased by over £1,431,432, the total amount borrowed being £4,066,261. There were 8,005 new instruments and 305 satisfactions.

Trade Marks and Patents

There was a marked decrease in the number of patent registrations and initial trade mark applications and registrations during the year, as also with other incidental trade mark and patent activities.

No trade mark applications were formally argued before the Registrar but several matters, as is inevitable, are in dispute, or are the subjects of interlocutory proceedings. One appeal from the Registrar's decision delivered some years ago was upheld.

Renewals effected in 1963 were in respect of those trade marks registered during the years 1949, 1935 and 1921. Registrations effected still continued to disclose a lively interest by applicants in most sections of the patent medicine and chemical trades.

PATENTS

There is no original registration of patents in Kenya, but only registration of patents previously granted in the United Kingdom. This registration has the effect of extending the patentee's rights to the patent in Kenya. In respect of these patents 72 were effected during the year, making a total of 1,269 (including 860 live patents) on the register at 31st December 1963. This is a slight decrease of 11 or 13 per cent over the comparative figure for 1962.

TRADE MARKS

Statistics relating to the general work of the Trade Marks and Patent Registry with comparative figures for the last decade are shown in Appendix VI. 567 trade marks were registered during the year, a decrease of 170, i.e. 23 per cent on the comparative figure of 737 for 1962. The number of initial applications received, 599, also showed a decrease of 71 on the 1963 figure of 670. The number of trade marks on the register as at 31st December 1963, was 9,186.

Birth, Deaths, Marriages and Naturalization Registration Section

This section carries out the work connected with the Registrar-General's duties as Registrar-General of Births and Deaths and of Marriages under the Births and Deaths Registration Act, the Legitimacy Act, the Adoption Act, the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act. Before Independence it also dealt with registration work in connexion with British naturalization.

VITAL STATISTICS

On the advice of a United Nations Civil Registration Adviser, a sample project for the compulsory registration of births and deaths for all races was started in Nairobi, Bungoma, Nyeri and the coastal locations of Kwale. Differing methods of effecting registrations in the field are being tried out in the course of the sample project. In Nyeri District registrations are being undertaken by schoolmasters in each sub-location, whilst health officials undertake the registration of births and deaths in their institutions. In Nairobi the work of registration is undertaken by the City Council through its public health department. After a trial period of 12 months, which will be completed in 1964, it will be possible to ascertain the extent to which registration for all races can be made compulsory in other districts of Kenya. Except in the districts covered by the project, the registration of African births is still not compulsory, whilst registration of African deaths is compulsory only in municipalities.

The current registration of African births increased from 103 to 11,041, and the registration of non-African births during the year totalled 7,855, compared with 7,457 in 1962. Late registrations increased from 1,812 in 1962 to 2,566. This increase was accounted for by a sudden demand by a section of the community for passports which gave rise to the need for birth certificates.

The total of African deaths registered was 8,597, compared with 6,922 for 1962.

The analysis of deaths registered during the year was based on the intermediate list of the International Classification of Diseases, Injuries and Causes of Deaths. Most deaths (940) were under the class "Broncho-pneumonia" followed by "Gastro-enteritis" (631).

MARRIAGES

The number of marriages celebrated under the Marriage Act and the African Christian Marriage and Divorce Act amounted to 6,554, reflecting an increase of 428.

NATURALIZATION

Up to Independence Day, the Registrar-General maintained a register of all certificates of naturalization issued in Kenya under the British Nationality Act, 1948. He was also responsible for preparing and sending to the British Government lists of persons registered as citizens of the United Kingdom and Colonies under the same Act. During the year, 3,083 persons were so registered. There was a large demand for nationality certificates shortly before Independence Day. All British naturalization and nationality records have now been handed over in good order to the British High Commission in Nairobi.

Public Trustee Section

This section carries out the administration of deceased estates under the Public Trustee Act and the management of trusts accepted under such Act. In the majority of cases the Public Trustee undertakes the administration of those estates where the assets are unadministered either because there is no heir who is prepared or is available to apply for letters of administration, or because the executor or administrator previously appointed has died or cannot be traced. In some cases the Public Trustee is specifically appointed to be an executor by a testator but in such cases the consent of the Public Trustee is required at the time of making the will. The advantages of appointing the Public Trustee to be an executor are, firstly, that there is guaranteed continuity of office by virtue of the Public Trustee's status as a corporation sole, and secondly, the fees charged by the Public Trustee for undertaking and completing the administration of estates are strictly regulated by statute and are not, therefore, subject to rapid change.

The Public Trustee is also from time to time appointed manager of persons of unsound mind under the Mental Treatment Act, and is required to make an annual report on accounts submitted by other managers during the course of each year.

The number of estates accepted for administration during the year was 672, making an increase of 127 over the previous year, and the number of estates finalized and distributed was up by 134, compared with 1962 with a total of 636 for the year. The gross value of all estates distributed in 1963 was £128,962. Details of payments to creditors and beneficiaries may be found at Appendix XV and details of assets held by the Public Trustee as at 31st December 1963, may be found at Appendix XXXIII.

Bankruptcy and Companies Liquidation Section

This section deals with bankruptcies, the compulsory winding up of companies and the registration of Deeds of Arrangement.

BANKRUPTCIES

There was a sharp, but nonetheless welcome, reduction in the number of fresh bankruptcies during the year. During the year 36 Receiving Orders were made, of which 8 were made at Mombasa, 1 at Kisumu and 27 at Nairobi. As at the end of December 1963, three bankruptcy petitions filed by the creditors were pending in Court. The total amount of deficiency as estimated by the debtors amounted to £57,545. Of the 36 debtors concerned, 22 were Asians, 13 were Europeans and 1 African. The amount of assets realized during the year from debtors' estates and from debtors' contributions from after acquired income was £99,215. From moneys realized, a sum of £84,277 was distributed in dividend to proved creditors. There was a record number of discharge applications made during the year.

There were fewer prosecutions during the year as a result of the reduced number of fresh bankruptcies. Having regard to this reduction of new work, the staff can now devote more time in carrying out the investigation and finalization of the backlog of cases, which number is still considerable.

During the year, all those estates where immovable properties were disclosed were examined and a special register was compiled. This involved extensive search and scrutiny of each and every estate dating back to 1960. Steps are now being taken to dispose of those properties which carry no encumbrances whilst the remainder are being transferred to secured creditors or disclaimed.

COMPANY LIQUIDATION

Here there was an increase in the number of cases in comparison with 1962, during which year the Official Receiver was called upon to liquidate only one company in compulsory winding-up; four winding-up orders in such companies were made by the Court this year, of which one was made at Mombasa and three at Nairobi. In another matter where a private liquidator was appointed, the Official Receiver had to take over the liquidation on the resignation of the former. The companies in liquidation comprised two trading in general merchandise and one each in the electrical contracting, manufacturers' representatives and motor dealing businesses.

DEEDS OF ARRANGEMENT

Two Deeds of Arrangement were registered during the year. One debtor was from Mombasa and the other from Nairobi.

GENERAL

In all those estates where the debtors were adjudicated bankrupt during 1960 and 1961 and were ordered to apply for their discharge at the expiration of two or three years, applications were made to the Court during the year. A total number of 129 applications were made, out of which two were granted their absolute discharge, 92 were suspended, and/or granted conditional discharge and 34 were refused. The work arising out of these applications was an additional factor in keeping the staff of the section very fully occupied throughout the year. There were several changes in the professional and clerical staff attached to the section during the year, which occasioned some dislocation in the smooth running of this section.

BANKRUPTCY CONTINGENCY FUND

The Income and Expenditure Account for the year 1963 and a Balance Sheet as at 31st December 1963, are set out as Appendix XX and Appendix XXI respectively. Out of this fund an extension to the offices of the Ministry was constructed, where the Bankruptcy and Company Liquidation staff are now exclusively housed. The opening ceremony of this extension was performed by the Honourable the Prime Minister on 19th September 1963 and was witnessed by a large number of distinguished guests from Government, professional and business circles.

Banks, Building Societies, Insurance Companies and Estate Duty

BANKS

During the year to 31st December 1963, the Kenya Building Society ceased operations as a building society and a new company, i.e. K.B.S. Ltd., was registered on 7th August 1963, as a wholly owned subsidiary of the Commonwealth Development Corporation. A licence to carry on banking business was issued under the provisions of the Banking Act.

The African Banking Corporation (E.A.) Ltd. was granted a banking licence on 11th October 1963.

Applications for a banking licence were received from the Afro-Italian Bank Ltd. and the Bank of Tokyo, which latter bank opened an office in Nairobi in July 1963. Negotiations are in progress for the granting of banking licences.

A schedule of the banks, hire finance companies and other companies which have been granted banking licences under the provisions of the Banking Act is set out in Appendix XXIX.

It may be noted that the following companies are licensed to conduct banking business, although they are not in fact accepting deposits from the public:—

United Dominions Corporation (E.A.) Ltd.

Lombard Banking (Kenya) Ltd.

Overseas Finance Ltd.

Standard Bank Finance and Development Corporation.

Statistics covering the operations of commercial banks in Kenya are published in the Kenya Statistical Abstract and the Statistical Supplement of the Kenya Trade and Supplies Bulletin. It is therefore considered unnecessary to reproduce them here.

BUILDING SOCIETIES

No new building societies were registered during the year to 31st December 1963, and as indicated under the reference to banks, the Kenya Building Society was registered as a licensed bank and a subsidiary company of the Commonwealth Development Corporation. The new company's operations are not now governed by the Building Societies Act, but the company is obliged to comply with the provisions of the Banking Act.

It may be noted that the remaining two building societies in Kenya are the Kentanda Mutual Building Society and the East African Building Society.

Statistics relating to building societies are set out in Appendix XXX.

INSURANCE COMPANIES

At 31st December 1963, 108 insurers were licensed to conduct insurance business in Kenya. During the year, four insurers ceased writing business and five licences were issued to new insurers.

Statistics showing the countries of origin of insurers and the classes of insurance business which they conduct may be found at Appendix XXXI.

Estate Duty

During the year estate duty was re-introduced with effect from 12th June 1963. Thereafter the work of the section involved dealing with estates, both of those passing under the old Estate Duty Ordinance, i.e. of the persons whose deaths occurred prior to 29th April 1959, and those passing after the enactment of the new Estate Duty Act. In the circumstances, the figures given in Appendix XXVII do not serve as a proper basis of comparison. They have, however, been split up into two groups viz. "old" and "new" so as to give a clear picture of the two different types of case.

Out of the total number of 76 estates assessed during the year, 60 estates were assessed under the new Act and the duty assessed amounted to £66,982. A balance of 16 estates were assessed under the old Ordinance and the amount of duty assessed was £2,523.

Of the total number of estates passing and assessed under the new Act, no duty was assessed in 38 estates, i.e. 63.33 per cent, as the net value in each case did not exceed £5,000. In the remaining 22 estates, i.e. 36.67 per cent, duty was assessed at percentages varying from 2 to 20. The corresponding figures for the estates assessed and passing under the old Ordinance were eight and eight.

The number of estates re-assessed during the year was 30; the re-assessment in all these estates was made under the old Estate Duty Ordinance and the additional duty involved was £5,520.

In two estates, where the assessed amounts had remained unpaid, further Corrective Affidavits were filed, which resulted in a decrease of £9,581 in the amount of duty outstanding. This decrease was in addition to the amount of £1,286 remitted under the provisions of the old Ordinance in regard to war casualties.

The net amount of duty collected during the year was £68,112.

A refund of £1,341 was made during the year in respect of old estates. No refund was made under the new legislation but it is expected that refunds will be claimed at a later date, when agreements with other countries are entered into for the purpose of giving relief from double taxation.

Trade Unions

There were 71 trade unions on the Register at the end of the year, comprising 54 employees and 17 employers trade unions. A break-down of these unions consisted of: employees—4 European; 6 Asian; 3 African and 41 with mixed membership. Employers: 1 African and 16 with mixed membership.

During the year three new unions were registered and the registration of two unions was deferred. One of the newly registered unions, namely the Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union, was formed by the amalgamation of three registered unions, namely the General Agricultural Workers' Union, Sisal and Coffee Plantation Workers' Union and the Tea Plantation Workers' Union. In consequence of their amalgamation the names of the three separate trade unions were removed from the Register. The dissolution of two employers' trade unions, namely the Master Builders' Association of Kenya and the Food Processing Employers' Association, was registered during the year.

Applications for registration from 11 trade unions were refused. Nine of these applications were received from breakaway factions of registered trade unions, the other two applications being received from the Kenya Employees Congress and the Kenya Labour Congress, both of which bodies purported to represent the interests of multifarious trades and industries which were already represented by other registered trade unions. None of the unions appealed against refusal of registration.

Three employee trade unions changed their names during the year and these changes were duly registered. Two of the changes related to trade unions representing the interests of postal workers, namely "East African Posts and Telecommunications European Staff Association (Kenya)" changed to "East African Posts and Telecommunications Controlling Officers Association—Kenya" and the "Posts and Telecommunications African Workers' Union (Kenya)" changed to "Union of Posts and Telecommunications Employees (Kenya)". The British Airline Pilots Association changed its name to Kenya Pilots' Association and also widened its field of recruitment.

During the course of the year officers of the Trade Unions Section carried out inspections of 151 sets of trade union books of account, comprising the accounts of 65 head offices and 86 branches. In addition to the inspections carried out in Nairobi, inspections were also carried out at Mombasa, Nyeri, Kericho and Kisumu. Resulting from these inspections the treasurers of two trade unions were prosecuted for failing to comply with the requirements of the Trade Unions (Accounts) Regulations and the treasurer of one trade union was prosecuted for misappropriation of trade union funds. On conviction fines were imposed upon the treasurers for failing to comply with the requirements of the Regulations and the treasurer who had misappropriated union funds was put on probation for a year. The secretaries of three trade unions were prosecuted for failing to submit their unions' annual returns and each of these prosecutions resulted in convictions with fines being imposed upon the secretaries. In spite of the frequent inspections and advice given to the officials of trade unions, the maintenance of the majority of the trade unions' books of account could be greatly improved.

An increasing number of trade unions are now having their members' subscriptions collected by the employer through the "check-off" system resulting in the unions being more financially secure and better able to meet their commitments.

Details of the book and voting membership of the trade unions on the Register, with particulars of their income and expenditure as shown by their annual returns, are set out in Appendix XXVII hereto. The totals of the book and voting members of employee trade unions were 163,656 and 155,926 respectively, whilst employers' trade unions had a total of 874 book members and 858 voting members.

Societies, Books and Newspaper Section

SOCIETIES

At the end of the year there were 2,435 registered societies and 1,035 societies which were exempted from registration.

The volume of work remained virtually the same as last year. 505 new registrations were effected as against 532 in 1962 and 112 societies were exempted as against 123 in 1962. 16 societies were refused registration, 2 had their registration cancelled and 130 ceased to be registered or exempted as they had ceased to exist. The racial breakdown of the 505 societies registered was: African 387, Asian 7, European 1, multiracial 99, Somali 3, Arab 2, Sudanese 3, Ethiopian 2 and Mozambican 1.

Ten new political societies were registered, comprising four African societies (plus five branches), one Somali, one Mozambican and four multiracial societies. In addition, branches of existing political societies were registered as follows: African 33, multiracial 20 and Somali 2.

Systematic inquiries are still being made in respect of societies which have apparently ceased to exist without notifying their dissolution to the Registrar.

As in former years, a great deal of time was spent in assisting new societies to complete applications for registration in the prescribed manner. It was noted, particularly during the latter part of the year, that many trading organizations were applying for registration under the Societies Act instead of the Companies, Business Names or Co-operative Societies Act as the case may be. In such cases the applicants were advised that applications could not be accepted and were referred to the appropriate authority.

BOOKS AND NEWSPAPERS

At the end of the year there were 56 newspapers and 215 books registered. During the year six new newspapers were registered and six newspapers ceased publication, while 58 new books were registered. Of the new books, 21 were in English, 33 in a vernacular and 43 English/Vernacular.

Accounts Section

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

Fees collected by the Department in respect of its various services totalled £72,499. A further £69,453 was collected as Estate Duty and miscellaneous revenue amounted to £1,241. The total expenditure of the Department on personal emoluments and other charges was £57,350.

Establishment

The establishment of professional officers of the Department remained the same throughout the year, but there were constant changes of senior experienced staff who left to join other legal departments or on retirement and for most of the year the Department was seriously under strength. The position had improved slightly at the end of the year, however, and it is hoped that during the ensuing year stability of staff will be achieved.

An in-service staff training course was held by the Department during the year from April to July. The purpose of this course is to train newly apointed members of the clerical staff in the specialized work of the Department and to help them to acquire the technical knowledge required to fit them for advancement to the executive grades when they have obtained the necessary practical experience.
